ing related to the increase in density from the original approval and lot size, transition, general impact on the environment with reference to habitat, wetlands, open space, increase in traffic, impact on water and risk of wild fire."

Barlow said the development had been pulled back from the northern and western boundaries of the property and a buffer at the southern boundary had been strengthened. The removal of a proposed road in the north had allowed larger lots in the area. She stressed that the current proposals provided 23 percent more open space than before. She said, "So while we have

gained in the number of lots, our impact on the open space, the topography, the natural features of the site have actually quite significantly reduced."

Addressing density concerns, Barlow said, "This isn't a high-density development. We're at 0.63 dwelling units per acre. That's pretty low." Regarding traffic, she said that at full build-out, including the school, the project would be at half the road capacity and that Classic Homes intended to install traffic calming measures.

acknowledged Barlow that the area is susceptible to wildfire but said that the evaluation report had made suggestions for landscaping
