

the board meeting:

- Teacher representatives said teachers were desperate to be back with kids but have some concerns about consistency and do not favor the more restrictive cohorting model. They confirmed that the maximum number of students in a class would include both in-person and live-streaming.
- A question-and-answer session was held on Aug. 13 ahead of the regular MA board meeting to answer parents' specific questions on the back-to-school plan.
- The board tabled the 2020-21 Instructional Time and Attendance Policy on July 29 and passed it unanimously on Aug. 13. This policy talks about how to account for

instruction time in an on-line/virtual format.

- The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) Policy was passed unanimously. This provides funds for paid sick leave and must be added to the employee handbook.
- Herrera said they were

still looking into the possibility of a shuttle for transportation between the campuses but that the cost was \$3,400 per month or \$35 per month per family. Masks and social distancing would be

required on the shuttle. A survey will be sent out to gauge interest.

- Board President Melanie Strop reported that a move-in date was set for the new school, a detour was in place until the
