2020 audit

At the April 20 meeting, Tom Mistare from Hoelt-ing and Co. presented the 2020 audit to the board, saying it presented fairly. Though Mistare said the pandemic caused his team to work re-motely, he gave an unmodified, clean opinion of the district’s financials.

As with his review last year, he suggested a segregation of duties as part of a more robust in-ternal control.

FLSA audit almost complete

District counsel Michelle Ferguson said the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) audit was almost complete in March, but then the board considered including wildland fire reimburse-ments. After an FLSA audit for past payroll, the district realized there were pay-

ment discrepancies. Ferguson said that without including the reimbursements, employees were owed \$12,000 in total. If reimbursements are added in, the employees are owed a total closer to \$27,000.

Chairman Mark Gunderman confirmed the board’s philosophy doesn’t change regarding paying for unpaid payroll. He confirmed that al-though payroll had been processed in March, no payments had gone to employees. See www.ocn.me/v21n4.htm#dwfpd.

Schwarz asked if employees will be notified of the extra pay so they can be pre-pared for the associated taxes. Since

Administrative Assistant Stacey Popovich is sending letters to all those who should expect reimbursements, the board directed her to tell staff how to change their tax status and the time frame for completing the change.

The meeting adjourned at 5:07 p.m.
