She is currently teaching one extra class essentially for free, which

means she is handling a total of 188 students. Monroe says the pay freeze should end, and perhaps it should be made less expensive for her to send her child to D-38 schools. She lives in Falcon, and it would cost her \$200 more to send her son to the school system she works for. with special education, the ESS department now also monitors progress by English Language Learners (ELL), Response to Intervention (RtI) students and those with Section 504 learning plans (generally, students with problems such as vision, hearing, or emotional disabilities as well

as cognitive problems). The vision of the department is to offer access to the general education curriculum to all students. There are currently 560 students in special education. There are resources in each school building to provide services. In addition, the new STAR pro-
