Front Range Animal Clinic replat approved

The board unanimously approved an ordinance for a replat of Vision Holding LLC's Visions Second Subdivision in the north end of the Monument Plaza Shopping Center. The 4.71-acre vacant lot at 481 Highway 105,

between the Columbine Restaurant and Serranos Coffee Co., behind the Starbucks drive-through restaurant, would be split into two lots. The new northern 1.00-acre lot would be used for the new Front Range Animal Hospital. The replat was recommended for approval by the Monument Planning Commission on Dec. 11. (www.ocn.me/vl4n1.htm#monp1211)

The town staff is reviewing a site plan concurrently with the replat for the animal hospital. Since the Vision Holding prop-

erty is zoned C-1, the site plan is reviewed administratively. The hospital's site plan will not be scheduled for either a Planning Commission or Board of Trustees public hearing.

The approved replat Front Range will allow Front Range to expand its current operation and provide services for more animals. Front Range hopes to

break ground at this new location in February.

Goodwill bond approved

The board unanimously approved an emergency ordinance that authorized the town to issue a refunding and improvement variable rate revenue bond for a Discover Goodwill of Southern & Western Colorado Project, Series 2014, in an amount not

to exceed \$17 million to assist Goodwill in financing and refinancing many of its retail facilities located in Monument and in El Paso County, Pueblo County, Mesa County, and Fremont County.

Under the state constitution, the Series 2014 Bond can't "constitute a debt or indebtedness" of the town.



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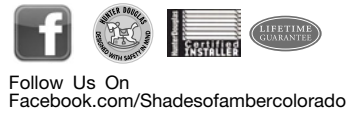
